Our Story

Community Living York South (CLYS) is a not-for-profit organization operating since 1954 that provides supports/services to children, youth, adults and seniors who have an intellectual disability and their families living in the Southern York Region (Richmond Hill, Markham, Vaughan, Thornhill, Whitchurch-Stouffville). The agency provides a comprehensive suite of services that support people in directing their own lives and promotes self-sufficiency, increased opportunities, community partnerships, well-being, and meaningful participation in one's community. Our mission is to empower people with an intellectual disability to live, learn, work and participate in their community. Throughout the years, CLYS has worked tirelessly to create and maintain innovative approaches to programming responding to the unique needs of the community.

In 2018, CLYS received a Multicultural Community Capacity Grant through Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration to provide support for newcomer Chinese families caring for individuals with intellectual disabilities. Through participating in this project, the newcomer families had increased knowledge of accessible supports and services for individuals with an intellectual disability, which in turn, had a positive impact in their overall caregiving experience and transition to a new country. In aspiration to share this wealth of available resources with other families, who are new to the developmental service sector, "GET STARTED!" was created. The purpose of this guide is to outline some of the resources available to individuals with an intellectual disability and their families within Southern York Region, thereby connecting them to vital resources from time of diagnosis to help them get started. Information in this guide includes: Community/Service Connections, Developmental Services Agencies, Government Funding, Tax Credits/Benefits, Immigrant services for Newcomers, Medical/Health, Mental Health/Counselling Services, Education (Elementary and Secondary), Education (Postsecondary), Training & Employment Programs, Public Libraries, Community Centres, Recreation Departments, and Public Transportation.
